

### Sporting Rifle Match Saturday, January 30, 2010

#### Match time: Sign-Up begins 8:30 AM. Firing begins at 9:00 AM. Competition open to: All (neither MSI nor NRA membership required.)

Match Director: Kerry Johnson



Qualified Rifle: Any centerfire rifle 8mm or less with optical or iron sights. The rifle should hold a minimum of 4 rounds total with at least 3 rounds in a well or magazine.

FEES: Member • \$8 Non-member • \$10 Jr. Member (18-20) • \$4 Jr. Non-Member (18-20) • \$6

Rules : Current NRA Competition Rules (with the exception of the Cold Barrel and Bonus stage), All firing at 100 yards, Stages 1-4 Standard SR1 100 vard target. Participants may use rifle match shooting equipment.

### Course: 100 yd range, up to 10 minutes of sighters and 36 shots for record

- Cold Barrel Stage 3 shots any position in 2 minutes (max 30 points)
- Sighter Stage Unlimited sighters any position(s) in 10 minutes
- First Stage Slow fire prone (loading one cartridge at a time). 8 record shots in 8 minutes.
- Second stage Slow fire, standing (loading one cartridge at a time). 8 record shots in 8 minutes.
- Third stage Rapid fire, sitting. 8 record shots in two separate 4 round 30 second firing periods. 60 seconds to reload 4 rounds between the two firing periods.
- Fourth Stage Rapid fire, prone. 8 record shots in two separate 4 round 30 second firing periods. 60 seconds to reload 4 rounds between the two firing periods.
- Special Add-on Bonus Stage 6 shots for record in 2 minutes at 3 briguettes at 100 vards. Each briguettes hit counts 10 points: maximum points 30.

Club rifles and Ammunition are available for use in the match: You may use a club M1 Garand, Springfield M1903, or .30 caliber Carbine (all iron sights). If you use a club rifle you are required to purchase Sixty rounds of club ammunition on the line. Cost \$20.00. Please notify the club if you wish to use a club rifle.

### A Special Story from MSI Youth Programs 2009

This story is a good example of why every member of Manteca Sportsmen Inc. should be proud of your club. I would hope that each of us repeats this story to friends, acquaintances, and relatives to help them understand the "positive" side of the story about shooting sports and Manteca Sportsmen.

Amy McFerrin first participated in ,22 indoor rifle training and shooting in early April 2009 with the Lathrop Sea Cadets at Manteca Sportsmen Inc. Amy is a natural shooter who had never previously participated in the shooting sports but she quickly learned to shoot very well. MSI members coached Amy in private lessons, and she was given additional opportunities to learn to shoot a variety of U.S. Military firearms. She continued to participate in training and shooting with the Lathrop Civil Air Patrol at Manteca Sportsmen Inc. until mid June 2009 when she left to enter the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis Maryland as a Midshipman.

Upon arrival at Annapolis, Amy tried out for various Academy shooting teams. As a result, Amy has earned a place in the Naval Academy's pistol team and High Power Rifle team by demonstrating the highest tryout scores ever earned. Additionally, even though a freshman may not be a member of the Academy's Rifle team she was asked to be the team's manager this year.

I have told this story to remind us how our club can be involved in helping good things happen for our youth. Please repeat this story to others as a way to help them understand what MSI is and what MSI does for our community.
