Rosanna Lehmann 599-6531 Rosanna@Clearwire.net June 26, 2008, the Supreme Court affirmed, in a 5-4 decision, the ruling of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit that the Second Amendment protects a pre-existing, private, individually-held Right to Keep Arms and to Bear Arms, without regard to a person's relationship to a militia. In its opinion in *District of Columbia v. Heller* the Supreme Court ruled that the amendment does not protect a right to possess arms only while serving in a militia, or a "state's right" to maintain a militia. In fact, no dissenting justice endorsed the "state's right" theory. The decision strikes down the District's ban on handguns and on having a gun in operable condition at home, as violations of the Second Amendment. However, the decision does not strike down other gun laws in D.C. or elsewhere, which were not at issue in this case.

Gun control groups have claimed to take heart from the Court's comments suggesting certain types of restrictions could still be constitutional, such as "laws prohibiting the carrying of firearms in sensitive places such as schools and government buildings, or laws imposing conditions and qualifications on the commercial sale of firearms. However, those groups should take little comfort in the opinion as a whole, which thoroughly rejects all "collective right" interpretations of the Second Amendment, and recognizes the Second Amendment protects a right that existed before the Constitution itself and that encompasses protection of individual self-defense.

We look forward to seeing you at the July 4th Kid's Shoot!





Good News! Our targets have recently been updated to compressed carpet bales! And, we have a ...

3-D Shoot! # We are hosting a 3-D Shoot weekly until August 14th. Each session will begin at 4:00 pm and end about 7:30. Cost is \$8 per shooter. The shoot will consist of 14 animals with unmarked yardages and only arrows with field points will be allowed and two arrow shots at each animal! Be sure to come and check it out!

Practice Range

The practice range consists of 5 targets ranging from **20-60** yards with two bow stands and a picnic table for relaxing and enjoying the day or tuning your equipment.

Field Range

The 9 field rounds have 32 shooting markers with yardages from 10 to 100 yards.
