

Entry Fees: Member \$8 / Jr Member (12-18) \$4 • Non Member \$10 / Non Jr Member (12-18) \$6 Match Time: Squadding begins 8:30 AM. Firing begins at 9:00 AM.

Rules: CMP Competition Rules, As Issued Military Rifle Match, 100 yard Standard SR1 targets. No alibis or refires for rifle or ammunition malfunctions. Maximum score: 300.

Rifles: As-issued preferred (remember you can use club Garands, Springfields, and Carbines): U.S. rifles, caliber .30, M1903, M1917, M1, M1941 (all in.30-'06 only), U.S. carbine, caliber .30 M1, or U.S. magazine rifle or carbine, caliber .30, M1892, 1896, 1898, or 1899 (Krag). Rifles will be checked to verify "As-Issue" status.

Minimum Rifle Requirement: Military centerfire rifle 8mm or less with iron sights.

Ammunition available: M2 Ball [HPX] (.30-'06) will be available for sale on the line.

Competition open to: Any competitor 12 years of age or older with appropriate signed wavers may enter this match.

Other Equipment Permitted: Standard issue web and leather slings or slings of the same type are permitted. Shooting jackets, spotting scopes, gloves and shooting mats may be used.

NOTE: CMP Military Rifle Match Achievement Award medals will be issued to shooters who achieve qualifying scores. (Example scores for M1 Garands: Gold: 276 and above – Silver: 269 -275, - Bronze: 257 -268)
